If you have ever felt you could lose your salvation, you're probably relying on all those good works. Be assured that only trusting completely in Jesus can give assurance of eternal life

Of course, He wants us to be good! But He doesn't want us to trust in our works. He wants us to depend that God Himself died to pay the entire punishment for all our sin.

Stop relying on how good you have been, and just enjoy being good because He loves you! And let Him smile on your life.

Here are 22 “works” from the Bible. I try to do them all consistently, but if my eternal life depends on keeping them, I fail— unless God were to grade on a big curve.

God's 20 Question Test

Here are 4 clear verses which explain why we know salvation doesn't require any good works,

“Not [even partly] by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us.” Titus 3.5

“To him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.” Romans 4.5

“These things have I written unto you that believe in the name of the Son of God that ye may **KNOW** that ye have eternal life.” I John 5.13

The above verse does not say you can KNOW if you obey. It says you can KNOW if you believe !
