	TEACHING 3 OR 4 TOPICS AT THE SAME TIME
	Teacher reads a passage of Scripture.
	Groups of students listen for different things.
1.	Strengths High student involvement. Subgroups listen diligently. As many as 4 topics can be studied at the same time. The topics are discussed separately, and woven together. Even though a participant is not focused on the other topics, in the back of his mind he may be processing it anyway.
2.	Weaknesses not many
3.	Tips Arbitrarily divide the students into 4 "groups" [if only 4 students are present, each one is his own "group"]. Rewards or kudos can be given to the "group" which seemed to listen the best. Hand out paper and pencil to every person to take notes. A "class" of 7 might be divided into even smaller units, perhaps 3 or 4 people will work together.
