

Developing community within the group

- 1. Ownership of the group will be in the hands of the group, not the adult advisors.
- 2. The primary role of the adult advisors is to develop the leadership of the aroup members and to help represent the group to the church boards.
- 3. The adult advisors will serve as catalysts for growth, give guidance for direction, assume responsibilities only when the members are unable, provide encouragement and training in leadership, and serve in continuity as the group's complexion changes through the years.
- 4. Triads/Quads/Quids:
 - Each person in the group would belong to a mini-group consisting of 3, or 4, or 5 people.
 - How these mini-groups are formed would be decided later: they might be formed according to existing friendships, or gender, or similar interests, or geography, or age
 - Whether there is a "leader" is not important.
 - The triad/guad/guid would function to: share prayer reguests, encourage each other in evangelism, remember birthdays, work as task teams in planning for larger group events, e-mail each other weekly, ...
 - How newer members of the college/career group would be added, and how groups would divide would have to be determined; however, it is expected that these groups would not be static. Newcomers would be absorbed into these mini-groups easily and groups would divide when they reach about 6 people.
- 5. Leadership responsibilities should be distributed as widely as possible. Tasks will generally be naturally assumed by those whose spiritual gifts & talents lie in the areas where help is needed: music, phone calling, handling finances, photographer/historian, teaching, organizing, hospitality, evangelism, arranging transportation, secretarial, leading meetings, webmaster, etc.
