Of course, He wants us to be good! But He doesn't want us to trust in our works. He wants us to depend that God Himself died to pay the entire punishment for all our sin.

Stop relying on how good you have been, and just enjoy being good because He loves you! And let Him smile on your life.

Here are 27 "works" from the Bible. I try to do them all consistently, but if my eternal life depends on keeping them, I fail — unless God were to grade on a big curve.

God's 27 Question Test

Anthony, an acquaintance of mine, made the argument that the Bible says, "Faith without works is dead." Actually, the context of that verse is that **You see** 2.22, 24 and **show** me 2.18 that a man is justified by works. God has eyes that can see faith. You and I can only see works.

Certainly, **you** should see my faith by my good works.

Please read Romans 3.20 through chapter 4.16. Then of these verses [out of 32] clearly say we are saved without works.

Was our guest saved? I think not. Why?
Because she was trusting in her good works
instead of trusting in Jesus Christ for her
salvation. She felt she could not be saved
without being good. She actually seemed to be
depending on her good works even more than
you're relying on holy living, it's not about
deciding mostly for yourself or trying your best or
working harder or getting better—it's about
completing obedience all the time.
