- 1.2 *the churches of Galatia*, Iconium, Antioch, Lystra, Derbe [central Turkey]
- 1.6 <u>another</u> [heteron] <u>Gospel which is not another</u> [allo], They've been snookered into thinking that this different message of the Gospel is just a different expression. It is not. It is false. It includes works for salvation.

  \* OT Jews attending these church plants on Paul's first tour had crept into these new congregations.
- 1.8 <u>though we 'or angel from heaven' preach any other Gospel unto you</u>, this phrase 'or an angel from heaven' should have rung a bell in any Jew's brain.
  - \* I Kings 13.18—The old prophet deceived the young prophet by telling him that <u>an angel from heaven</u> gave him different instructions than God had given to the young prophet. God killed the young prophet for listening.

accursed, not very gentle language

- 1.12 <u>I received...by the revelation of Jesus Christ</u>, curious that God hadn't made this message crystal clear before this point in the life of the early Church, i.e. 49 or 50 AD
- 1.17 *Arabia*, = S.A.D. Seminary of the Arabian Desert, *II Cor* 11.32,33, several years?
- 1.21 *Cilicia*, the county of Tarsus, Saul's hometown
- 2.1 <u>Barnabas</u>, the first church missionary who had ever been sent. Sent years before to Antioch by the church of Jerusalem, Acts 11.22

Paul travels with <u>Barnabas</u> to <u>Jerusalem</u> = Acts 15, "Jerusalem Council" AD 50

2.3,4 **Titus** [not] **circumcised**, to show Paul didn't have to keep Mosaic Law

Timothy was circumcised to show to Jews in Lystra that Paul did keep Mosaic Law, Acts 16.3.

\*No, we are under the moral laws set out in the OT and are forbidden to break the 10 Commandments [less Sabbath keeping].

\* There was a small movement defying all laws and based on such verses as: I Cor 6.12 10.23

v.22-23 *Fruit of the Spirit* [rather than expressed as "Commands of the Spirit"]

\* A 9-fold compendium of obedience.

\* "Fruit is to be eaten, not displayed." Warren Wiersbe

6.1 <u>overtaken in a fault [sin]</u> = stuck, caught Nobody falls into immorality, or dishonesty. We march into it hoping the consequences don't outweigh the pleasure.

6.2-5 **burdens**, it may be my friend's own fault, but he needs a friend to help him out

6.3 when he is nothing, Phil, don't try to make yourself look better than anyone else. Just be faithful.

6.6 <u>let him that is taught...communicate</u>,
