FATHER: In olden times reclining at the table was a sign that you were a free man. Tonight we recline to remind us that we are free.

[Sing "Go Down, Moses"]

Each time Pharaoh refused to let the Hebrew people go, God sent a plague as a punishment. It was only after the tenth plagues that Pharaoh sent our people out of Egypt. These are the ten plagues.

[Each time we say the name of a plague, everyone is to dip his little finger into the fruit of the vine and put a drop on his plate.] SON OF THE HOUSE:#2 On all other nights we eat vegetables as we wish. Why on this night do we eat bitter herbs?
