SPAIN & ILLYRICUM (ALBANIA)

Spain, Paul's 4th Missionary Tour: "whenever I take my journey into Spain. . . . " Rom 15.24

History verifies that Paul made it to Spain on a 4th missionary trip (after release from Nero's Roman prison) by the testimony of these 4 early historical documents.

- Clement, writes in 95 AD [30 years after Paul's death]

 "[Paul] had preached in the East and in the West... having reached the farthest limits of the West."

 I Clement 5.5-7
 - * To the Romans, the "farthest reaches" would have meant Britain, Gaul [France], or Spain.
- The Acts of Peter [end of the 2nd century] affirms the statement of Clement.
- The Muraturian Fragment [7th century] also affirms the statement of Clement.
- <u>Eusebius</u>, (4th century church historian) supported Paul's release from jail, after Rome.
 - *We believe Paul was beheaded in Rome, circa 66 AD, after being re-arrested.

Illyricum, Paul's 3rd Tour Side Trip, Rom 15.19

". . . and round about unto Illyricum, I have fully preached the Gospel of Christ."

- * Illyricum covered an area northwest of Macedonia which was north of Greece. It is modern day Albania, Croatia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, and Montenegro along the coast of the Adriatic Sea.
- * A logical starting point for such a trip might be Berea as a side trip taken *on his 3rd missionary tour*. My opinion.
- * However, Paul mentions that he would come to "Corinth after I go through Macedonia." [I Cor 16.5] This seems to be his 2nd tour.
- * One other comment occurs in Acts 20.2. "When [Paul] had gone through those parts." What parts? Illyricum?
