Judges, choosing them

There seems to be no uniform method of appointment. Six were divinely chosen, several seem to be volunteers. Jephthah was recruited by brothers who had already run him out of town.

Jephthah's Vow Judges 11

- * "Don't let the vow overshadow the magnificent victory"
- * Judges 11.30,31 vow: a sign of faith, not a bargain with God
- * Eccl 5.4,5, "When thou vowest a vow. . . ."
- * Not a human sacrifice, clearly forbidden by

Mosaic Law pjm
* Lev 18.21 [the practice of pagan temple prostitutes]

- * Neighbors would have stopped him, but there was no repercussions or social flak [recorded] pjm
- * God's blessing is obviously on his victory [away for several weeks or months?]
- * No rebuke before, or chastening afterwards from God.
- * Just deep sadness over daughter's celibacy
- * He expected a person [not a sheep or dog] to greet him out of his house.
- * His decision was to honor God, to offer an person as a sacrifice instead of "going to sacrifice on an altar."

рјт

- * He knew a family member or servant would be his offering.
- * It is hermeneutically inconsistent to think that he was planning to commit murder when he got home!

THE COMMON SENSE PRINCIPLE of interpretation

* His piety would have led him to the Tab to make a sacrifice, not to his backyard grill.

Judges 16.1-3, Weight of Samson' City Gates

- Weight of the <u>city gates</u>? A ton? [a Toyota compact]
- 38 miles to <u>Hebron</u>, uphill [Ryrie says "at a brisk trot"] He went through 2 major towns at night and returned.
- A bull elephant could hardly trot 38 miles [4 hours at 9 mph, one way] to Hebron overnight carrying that weight.
- Yes, his strength was a miracle not weight training.

10 Divisions of Theology

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- No wonder the people thought of it an amulet [lucky charm].
- ♦ The Philistines were defeating Israel at Aphek. The elders said, "...take the Ark...that it may come among us and deliver us from the power of our enemies," I Sam 4.3, 7 months.
- When the Ark was returned on a cart by oxen which stopped at Joshua the Beth-Shemite's house, 50,070 Jews looked into the and died, I Sam 6.19
- ♦ The Ark blessing at Joshua's house at Beth-shemesh
- Like everyone else's idols it had become a good luck charm? or worse—an idol which guaranteed God's presence and power?
- The Tabernacle stayed at Shiloh for 389 years [Jewish lore], but the Ark only stayed there for several years until Saul takes it again into battle against Philistines. But the Ark was not returned there, ever. [I Sam 14.18]
- The Ark was housed in a couple different places until David brought it to Jerusalem and build a tent for it.
 - * Possibly actually a Mosaic Tabernacle. pim

The gang of "12" is called "The Eleven" by the three synoptic Gospels:

Matt 28.16 Mark 16.14 Luke 24.9,33

- Acts 1.26 clearly states that "Matthias. . . was numbered with the eleven apostles."
- Acts 6.2 Within a year God calls this band of brothers "the Twelve" which obviously included Matthias since God wrote it down.

nota bene: Some arbitrarily assume Paul is really the 12th apostle.

- * Great guess if God hadn't explicitly written Acts 6.2.
- * Some of those folks who disregard 6.2 forget that there are at least 9 other NT Apostles named in the book of Acts, although none were "numbered with the Eleven."

9 More NT Apostles, plus 8 NT prophets and 5 prophetesses.

- 1. One elder who is [salaried] pastor-shepherd, with many deacons who run the church, serve the people, relieve the pastor of pressure many Baptist churches
- 2. Elders = pastoral staff [salaried] several administrative positions, with multiple deacons who care for the church, serve the people, relieve the pastors, handle finances. Often the paradigm for megachurches and many churches over 250 people
- 3. Elders = plural pastors who shepherd the flock, no salaried senior pastor, with deacons who serve, This is common in Plymouth Brethren churches.

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Emperor Worship in the first century

Rome = 4th empire in Daniel in Nebuchadnezzar's dream of the great image

* Julius Caesar was first Roman to be deified but after his death?

> Caesar was hailed as "Dominus et Deus" [D et D], Latin meaning "Lord and God."

> > Greek, κυριοσ κατ τηεοσ

- Thomas used this "D et D" phrase in John 20:28 when he said to Jesus, "My Lord and my God."
- Tradition of public affirmation developed by the people [rather than by imperial fiat] that all citizens had to declare the emperor's deity annually, publicly
- * Only Domitian [81-96 AD] & Caligula voraciously embraced the title and demanded "D et D" from Jews, most other emperors more or less ignored the claim to deity.
- * Jews had been the only group exempted from "D et D" because the empire soon learned that Jews would die rather than bow and swear to emperors' deity
- * Christians were added to this exemption by association with Jewry.
- * Christianity was considered a sect of Judaism
 - Up till Domitian, "Christians were regarded as a variety of Jews and so entitled to tolerance.
- * Polycarp [disciple of apostle John] lost his life."

Word Pictures in the NT, Broadman, p. 27

- * Domitian's persecution of Christians who would not bow seems to have led to both John's exile on Patmos and his writing of the book of The Revelation.
- * Domitian even banished his cousin's wife, Domatilla [a Jewish proselyte or Jewish sympathizer], on the grounds of atheism for refusing to sacrifice to idols

E. She is kept from corruption of society

Only one parable has many parts explained by God Himself. Lengthy explanations are the exception rather than the rule. The tares.

FOR ALL OTHER PARABLES:

- Don't feel you have to explain every aspect of every parable.
- Look for only **one** main point.
- The parables were written for people, many of whom could not read. They weren't stupid, but just had no opportunity. Estimate is that many men could read, few women. But they could all grasp simple farmer's illustrations.
- Don't let complicated explanations of parables sidetrack you.

Pastoral Epistles [and James]

I think these 3 books [I & II Timothy, & Titus] are reiterations of some of Paul's campfire chats which he must have had with Timothy as they traveled thousands of miles by foot (?) around Asia Minor. Paul doesn't give much detail in these books. It seems as though he expected Tim to able to fill-in-the-blanks pretty easily. No topics are developed fully except perhaps elders and widows.

* We don't know how long Titus traveled with Paul.

The structure of the book is somewhat like 15 the scattered topics Pastor James [Jesus' brother] sent out one afternoon. James mailed copies to his former congregation members who had scattered after the persecution began. James' inspired notes were included in the canon of Scripture and were called "The Epistle of James."

The first readers from James' *diaspora* congregation would remember sermons he preached on those 15 topics. None of his 15 topics were developed like Paul's were in Romans, Corinthians, and Galatians.

#2 Acts 21.1-6 IGNORING SPIRIT'S DIRECT COMMAND

Ignoring the Holy Spirit's direct command not to go to Jerusalem was wrong.

There are 2 warnings to Paul [vss. . He disregards the Holy Sprit's message.

- The command which Paul disregards came directly from the Holy Spirit!
- vs. 4 "[disciples] told [kept telling] Paul, through the <u>Spirit</u>, not to go to Jerusalem." Paul absolutely gave no response and ignored the Holy Spirit's command.
- v.6 Paul continued his journey to Jerusalem by boat.
- I have not found one commentator [yet] who says Paul sinned. No one even comments on the fact that these friends of Paul spoke <u>"through the Spirit"</u>. Surely I'm not the only believer who thinks that it is wrong, even for Paul, to ignore a message sent by the Holy Spirit.
- vs.11 Ah, yes, it is true that in the very next paragraph [another city] another speaker [Agabus, a prophet] is sent by the Spirit and carries the message that Paul is granted permission by God that Paul is free to enter Jerusalem. But that does not negate the fact that the Spirit had given a direct command just 7 verses prior [remember Balaam]. We will admit that God allowed it after Paul's first refusal.
- Perhaps God's prohibition would have circumvented 2 years of imprisonment in Caesarea, physical pain, trouble for the local churches, etc. and allowed Paul to plant several more churches.
- Agabus, informs Paul, "thus said the Holy Ghost", it's okay to go to Jerusalem but you're going to get arrested. [21.11]
- Friends "knelt down on the beach and prayed", relentless prayer.

#3 Acts 21.21-24 OFFERING SACRIFICES TO PLEASE THE JEWS

Jews asked Paul to prove that "you yourself also walk orderly, keeping the Law."

Paul takes this vow specifically to prove he still obeyed the Mosaic Law. Anathema! Paul succumbs: "purifying himself...sacrificing."

- Paul was challenged to prove he was still under the Law [21.24].
- Here Paul falters under the pressure of "James and all the elders [v.18]".
- Paul's decision was just as wrong then as it would be today in the 21st century if members of our churches demanded that you and I also <u>"[vss. 24-26] purify... shave [our] heads...abstain from meat...[offer an animal] sacrifice"</u>. We're in the Church Age, same as Paul was.

It seems Paul made it to Spain on a 4th missionary trip after release from Nero's Roman prison, because of these 4 early historical documents.

- <u>Eusebius</u>, 4th century church historian, supported Paul's release from jail, after Rome.
 - *We believe Paul was beheaded in Rome, circa 66 AD, after being re-arrested

- a. II Thes 3.8 made tents in <u>Thessalonika</u> AD 52 Paul starts [Acts 18.3] then quits tentmaking two verses later [18.5].
 - Phil 4.14-19 probably Paul was in Thessalonika more than "Three Sabbaths" but only spoke in the synagogue for 3 Sabbaths then moved to another place.
